- III. **Youth Council Engaging Employers and Industry Sectors Projects Update**
  - Industry Sectors Project – Dana Katbah reported that she met with Jim Mize to discuss outreaching to businesses who hire youth. Jim stated that his team is focusing on the adult and dislocated worker population.

- V. **JTED Presentation** – Alan Storm  
Alan gave a brief overview and distributed information about JTED plus gave a tour of the Cosmetology and Nursing Program classrooms. JTED provides career and technical education in partnership with business, industry, and community stakeholders. JTED Satellite Program has twelve school district members. The satellite program is operated by the school and managed by JTED. JTED gives support to the twelve districts by providing professional development, curriculum resources, and funding for equipment/supplies. Any child in Pima County is eligible for the JTED program; however the student needs to be a full time student to receive funding. Programs available include: Cosmetology, Fire Services, Law Public Safety, Nursing Services, Auto, Healthcare, Graphic Design, Culinary, Early Childhood Education, Multimedia, Agriscience, and Precision Manufacturing-

Engineering. Project Search is a new program for special education students. There were 11 students in the program last year and all are currently employed. Alan noted that the FY2012 state budget eliminated career and technical education funding for 9th grade students.
