PIMA COUNTY WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD

PURPOSE: The Workforce Investment Board (WIB) was created in 1999 by the Pima County Board of Supervisors to comply with the requirements established by the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA) for the receipt of federal funding; and the development of plans and policy.

AUTHORIZATION: Workforce Investment Act (WIA); Board of Supervisors action of September 21, 1999; and Pima County Resolution No. 2011-23, adopted February 1, 2011.

MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION: Up to forty-five (45) members. The Act mandates a majority of business representation, and at least two representatives from the following areas: local education, labor, economic development, and community-based organizations. The Act also requires appointments from the following categories: Job Corps, Native American programs, migrant and seasonal farmworker programs, veterans' workforce programs, programs authorized under the Wagner-Peyser Act, adult education and literacy activities, vocational rehabilitation and welfare-to-work programs.

Except as provided in paragraph B(1) of the Bylaws, an appointment can be renewed indefinitely pursuant to the Intergovernmental Agreement between Pima County and the City of Tucson and in accordance with the WIA and regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
