

Bird Watching Opportunities and Protocols

The Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department has three water reclamation facilities that provide opportunities for bird watching. Each site is unique, and therefore protocols differ from site to site. Please carefully review the protocols for each site below and follow all rules/instructions provided on the website. You also are required to follow any rules posted on plant site and must always comply with directions provided by department staff even if instructions differ from rules found on the website or posted at the facility.

INFORMATION	<p>Park in the parking lot outside the main gate to the facility.</p> <p>From the parking lot, walk directly west and enter through a gate in the low fence between the parking area and the south end of the ponds and turn left.</p> <p>Bird watching is limited to the designated large ponds west of the facility.</p> <p>DO NOT go inside the high-security fence around the main plant facility.</p> <p>Do not go into the basins, touch or drink the water.</p> <p>Please note: Areas of the ponds may be inaccessible when heavy equipment and trucks are in operation. Please respect all chained areas and signage.</p>	<p>Due to changes in wastewater treatment processing at this facility there is now little standing water in the ponds.</p> <p>As a result, birds are no longer attracted to this once popular bird watching location.</p>	<p>Please note: Due to construction activities, this facility will be off limits to bird watchers until March 2014.</p>	<p>Please bring identification with you and check in with the security guard before entering the facility.</p> <p>Bird watching is limited to designated pond areas only.</p> <p>We are happy to host bird watchers whenever possible. Please obey all signs, safety protocols and staff directives when on site.</p> <p>Please note: This facility will soon be decommissioned.</p> <p>Visitation to this site may become limited or denied during closure or demolition activities.</p> <p>Future opportunities for bird watching at this site are undeveloped at this time.</p>

<p>I N F O R M A T I O N</p>	<p>Please obey all signs, safety protocols and staff directives when on site. Recorded bird calls are not permitted. To protect habitat value, access to any fenced area is prohibited except by prior agreement. Maintenance trails within the basin are not open to public access. The Tucson Audubon Society sometimes arranges field trips to the KERP. Closures: Sweetwater Wetlands is closed on Monday mornings in the warm season (usually from late March to mid-November) for application of mosquito-control substances.
